In the meantime we are all trying to take in the information as it comes to light. I have been out of the school a bit attending meetings and taking part in consultation. I believe that *now* is the time that principals should make sure they are heard *before* all the final decisions are put into place.

So - thank you for your patience at this very busy time. Our staff are also in the midst of assessment and reporting times as well as planning for next year. At this point in time I cannot guarantee how classes will look as our numbers are changing from day to day. Whether we have grades/composites or stages will depend very much on this. I would like to reassure parents that, regardless of our class structure, students learn. Our teachers are very well equipped to cater for a range of abilities in their classrooms and we find the range of abilities is no different in a composite class than a 'straight' one. The only difference is a wider age range. Children in small schools where there are K-6 students in one small class learn also - we are prepared for these situations when we are trained. I will continue to keep you informed of our planning for next year.
