## **Uniform Changes**

During 2012, the P&C surveyed parents about varying some parts of the school uniform. These results indicated that the majority of parents supported the change to white socks for both boys and girls along with the introduction of girls' navy shorts.

The school parliament consisting of student representatives also supported the change.

This was initiated in response to concerns about the availability and increasing price of red socks for girls and grey striped socks for boys. Parents also expressed a need for girls to have something to wear when undertaking more physical activities.

Please note that the girls' dress and skirt are still expected to be worn on special occasions (such as assemblies, eisteddfods or at any time our students are representing the school) and the shorts are not compulsory, just an option. The white socks are able to be purchased locally at a reasonable price and can be either anklets or normal style. Currently the uniform committee are still sourcing a supplier for the navy short. They should be available early in 2013. Red and grey socks will still be acceptable uniform in 2013 as the students current supplies wear out.

# Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)

KSPS staff is stressing these values with our students as we head into the last few weeks. This is a program we have in our school which actively looks at teaching and positively reinforcing positive learning behaviours. Led by Mrs Barry, this team meet weekly to ensure that these strategies are taught across our school.

We ask for your support over the next few weeks as students get a bit 'edgy' and unsure as they think about the changes that happen at the end of each year. Please continue to recognise the positive things your children do at home as positive reinforcement is the best way to ensure positive behaviours. If your child has a bad day, help them to look for the good things that happened and model positive ways to deal with situations for them.

# **Uniform Update**

Earlier this year a survey regarding school uniform was undertaken. Thank you to all those who took the time to fill out the survey and also those people who added comments. The 4 areas that we looked into were to introduce a white sock for both boys and girls; to introduce a navy short for girls; to introduce a unisex uniform; and to introduce a sports shirt.

Introducing white socks, a girls short and a sports shirt received a clear majority of yes votes. The unisex uniform was less clear in its results. From the results the uniform committee proposed to introduce a white sock and a navy short for girls for 2013, leaving the sports shirt for future discussions. The P&C Committee, school executive and the student parliament approved these changes to our school uniform.

At this point we have not found a suitable girls short due to a supplier dropping the short we had chosen. We will have to keep you all posted on the shorts. The white sock is to be plain white but can include an ankle sock. It is also expected the girls traditional skirt/dress be worn for more formal occasions or when representing the school.
