BUS PASSES 2013 (STSS)



Parents are reminded that ALL students in Kinder, Yr 1 & Yr 2 are entitled to free bus travel.

If your child is starting Yr 3 you need to re-apply for a bus pass. All other students with a current bus pass need

not apply, unless the student's address has changed Students who live outside that 1.6km radius will continue to receive free travel as long as they continue to attend school. Any students inside this radius will need to pay for travel.

<u>Year 3 students need to reapply for a bus pass if</u> <u>they are eligible, i.e. they live outside the 1.6km</u> radius from school.
