Safety around school crossings

- Where there is an unsupervised children's crossing:
- Drivers must stop at the white line if pedestrians are waiting to cross or are crossing, when the 'CHILDREN CROSSING' flags are displayed. Drivers must remain stationary until the crossing is completely clear of pedestrians.
- Drivers need to know that a children's crossing is a part-time crossing that operates before and after school hours, and at times when children are using the crossing, such as for excursions or during lunchtimes.
- The minimum penalty of a \$344 fine and the loss of 2 demerit points applies if you park or stop on or near:
 - A pedestrian crossing.
 - A children's crossing.
 - Any marked foot crossing.
- The minimum penalty of a \$344 fine and the loss of 4 demerit points applies for failure to give way to a pedestrian.
- Take extra care near the school crossing.

King Street Mobile App NOW LIVE!

Great News! Our school now has a mobile phone app. What's that you may ask, it is a little application that sits on your phone and gives you instant access to our school information when you click on it, 24/7. The app is going to give parents the ability to instantly access newsletters without going to the website, or to send in a sick note while you stand outside the school because you forgot to write a paper note! We will be sharing many of the other features with you over the coming weeks, but for now download it to your smartphone by going to either the Apple App Store or Android Google Play Market and search for '**King Street Public School**'. Once you have found it press install or download.

Features of the School App include:

- Our mobile app will let you add Events instantly to your calendar. Just click on the event and look for the + sign in the top right hand corner. Press the + and the Event is automatically added to your phone's calendar. You can then set reminders for yourself. Some phone models may not allow this feature.
- When you touch a pin on the Venues map it will show you the details of that venue. And did you know that if you click on the Directions button a new map will open specifically for the venue. You can then press the Get Here button in the top right hand corner to get directions from wherever you are to the venue. Some phone models may display this slightly differently.
- You can share the app with friends and other school parents by clicking on the Tell Friend button located on the home screen.
- You can change your details or send an absentee note directly to the school, without having to use a piece of paper. Simply click on the relevant tabs on the app.
- The web site (showcasing events calendar and newsletter) is accessible directly through the app.

Changes to Child Collection Requirements

On the occasions where your child is arriving late to school, or needs to be collected before the end of the day, it is a requirement that you notify the office. For the safety of our students, children need to be signed in and out if there is a variation to their normal school day.

The procedure at the office has changed slightly. **Following a directive from the Department of Education and Communities, parents/carers must have a valid reason for their child arriving late or being collected early.** For this reason, we now require the person collecting your child to enter the purpose of their early departure. BUS PASSES 2014 (STSS)



Parents are reminded that ALL students in Kinder, Yr 1 & Yr 2 are entitled to free bus travel.

If your child is starting Yr 3 you need to re-apply for a bus pass. All other students with a current bus pass need not apply, unless the student's address has changed. Students who live outside that 1.6km radius will continue to receive free travel as long as they continue to attend school. Any students inside this radius will need to pay for travel.

Year 3 students need to reapply for a bus pass if they are eligible, i.e. they live outside the 1.6km radius from school.

If your child is going to use free travel in 2014, please contact the office for an application form.



Keeping Our Kids Safe

Thank you to all those parents and carers who continue to use Sussex Street carefully when dropping off and collecting their children. At King Street it is of high importance to us that we keep all your children safe.

We continue to have a few motorists who appear to be unfamiliar with the RTA signage and laws, so we ask all motorists to be particularly aware of the following:

- There is **no parking** in the School Drop off/Pick up zone during the allocated 'kiss and drop' times.
- 'No Stopping' signs indicate **no stopping at any time**. These are generally in the more high risk areas.
- Motorists **must not leave their car** when stopping in the School Drop off/Pick up zone.
- The area immediately outside the Kindergarten gate **is not to be used to drop off children**. This is a 'No Stopping' area.
- It is **illegal** to drop off or pick up children in the middle of the road.
