Clues to keeping reading alive over the holidays:


Reading gets better when you practice it.

Reading helps improve children's writing.

Enjoy sharing a book at home with your child. Children love to hear a story read aloud.

- Try reading with different voices, lots of emotion, invented sound effects and funny faces. Change the tone in your voice. Have fun and enjoy it.
- Listen to your child talk about the story and the pictures.
- Try asking your child which parts of the book/s he or she found exciting, funny or different.
- Give your child the chance to choose the book to read.
- Try reading to your child and at other times ask your child to join in reading the book.
- Let your child hear how hill and home start with the same letter or how double and bubble rhyme.
- Visit the local library and choose books to read over the holiday it is free to join.
 - o Join the Singleton Library's summer reading club - there is a chance to win great prizes
 - o Take the children to Saturday Storytime at the Singleton Library
- Give your children books for Christmas and enjoy reading them together.
- When going on a car journey take a stash of books/magazines as well as writing materials so your child can write or draw pictures of what you do on holidays.
- Read a book and watch the movie adaption of it. Books such as the Lorax, Diary of a Wimpy Kid, Where the Wild Things Are.
- Read stories with numbers.
- Get your child to read while you are out shopping.
- Play 'I spy' with your children.
- Use rhyme whenever you can. Use phrases like "snug as a bug in a rug" or make up nonsense rhymes about what you are doing.
