Principal's Message

Term 1 Week 8 - 18th March 2020

Welcome to Week 8.

What an interesting week it has been... Firstly, I would like to express my sincere thanks to our parents, students and school community for supporting the changes and restrictions we have had to put in place to ensure the ongoing safety of our students and community. Social distancing and personal hygiene have become an important measure to restrict the spreading of the virus and everyone has played their part, for which I thank you!

Just to clarify some key points in relation to movements on school grounds:

- King Street gate entry will be the only gate remaining open during school, which will give clear and direct access to the school office. All other gates will be locked until the end of the day.
- If early pick-ups/late drops offs occur or school business requires your attendance on grounds, please ensure you limit your time by keeping your movements in and out very brief.
- It is okay to pick your child up early if you have a legitimate reason for doing so and that will be recorded, otherwise it will be an early departure unexplained.

There was communication about upcoming events that have been post-poned or cancelled in a letter that was shared on Monday with all students, as well as being uploaded to the school website and Facebook page. In addition to this information, Cracker Night will be post-poned pending further advice and the Mother's Day Stall which was scheduled for early next term has been cancelled. The P & C meeting scheduled for the 6th of April will go ahead as usual, at this time.

Bullying No Way Day is a national day of action against bullying and King Street always supports this day by delivering lessons and raising awareness of ways to deal with bullying and how to support their peers. Although the National Day of Action, which was planned for this Friday, has been officially post-poned, King Street will still go ahead with delivering this important message however will avoid mass gathering with lessons and activities being conducted in classrooms. With this students have also been learning about our 'High 5' system at KSPS. We will share a video on our Facebook page so all our families understand this proactive approach to dealing with conflict.

Finally, thank you to all of our amazing teachers for delivering additional lessons, scheduled and more frequent hand washing and increased hygiene practices to ensure we are keeping all of our students as safe as possible. It is unchartered times with lots of questions being raised every day. Please be assured we are constantly staying up to date with all the latest developments and advice and will continue to put in place the best possible support for our school community as this situation evolves. Thank you again, and stay safe – we all have a role to play.

Stage 3



Dear parents

At King Street Public School we aim to create a safe and supportive school community for everyone.

You are an important part of our work to prevent bullying and to respond effectively if it happens. Stopping bullying involves everyone.

We have included in our newsletter some tips from Bullying. No Way! on what to do if your child talks to you about bullying. Parents know their children best and know the best way to tailor communication to their needs. Adapt these tips to what works for you and your child.

If your child talks to you about bullying:

- Listen calmly and get the full story. Your calm response is important to allow your child to tell you all about the situation. After they've told you their story, ask questions to get more details if you need: who, what, where, when. Although you may feel some strong emotions about your child's experience, try to keep calm to avoid more distress to your child.
- 2. Reassure your child they are not to blame. Many children blame themselves and this may make them feel even worse. You could say things like, 'That sounds really hard to deal with. No one should have to put up with that.' or 'I'm so glad you told me. You should be able to feel safe at school; that's not fair at all'.
- **3. Ask** your child what they want to do and what they want you to do. A critical part of your response is to avoid jumping in to solve the problem. While it is natural to want to protect your child, helping them to find their own solution is a better option. It helps them feel they have some power in the situation.
- **4. Visit** <u>www.bullyingnoway.gov.au</u> to find some strategies. The website has tips and ideas for different bullying situations. One idea is to practice strategies at home to help your child feel more confident.
- **5. Contact** the school. Your child may be reluctant for you to do this, so discuss the idea and reassure them that the school would want to know and is able to help. Make an appointment to meet with your child's teacher and, if you need to, ask to talk with the Principal. Contact the school immediately if you have a concern about your child's safety.
- **6. Check in regularly** with your child. Keep the conversation going. It can take time to resolve issues, so check in regularly with your child about their experiences and their feelings. Your ongoing support is important.

This includes nutella and peanut butter spread.


JOIN THE KSPS BAND!




Keeping Hands Clean
