King Street Public School Uniform Policy

Rationale: This document has been created in consultation with and is endorsed by the KSPS P&C, Students and Staff. The Uniform Policy applies to all KSPS students. This was ratified by the P&C Association in September 2020. In designing these expectations, we have considered the very strong desire for our school to be a school of excellence, for our children to have pride in attending our school and the belief that children need to be well-groomed, clean to enable them to have the confidence to perform at their best.

Department Policy: King Street Public School adheres to and is underpinned by the School Uniform Policy set by the NSW Department of Education.



Summer:

- Red polo shirt with KSPS emblem.
- **Grey shorts**
- Navy shorts
- KSPS dress or skirt.
- White socks
- KSPS royal blue bucket hat.
- Black leather shoes or black leather joggers



Winter:

- Red Polo shirt with KSPS emblem.
- Grey pants, Grey Track pants, Navy bootleg pant or Navy track pant
- KSPS royal blue bucket hat.
- Royal blue polar fleece school jacket with embroidered emblem.
- KSPS dress or skirt and navy stockings



Sports Uniform

Sport Uniform:

Students are required to wear their sports uniform on Friday and when advised. This involves:

- Red polo shirt with KSPS emblem.
- Royal blue shorts
- Appropriate shoes (joggers)
- KSPS royal blue bucket hat.

Children must:

- Be clean and tidy each day.
- Children are allowed to bring roll-on deodorant only.
- Wear only blue or red head accessories.
- Not to wear any Henna or transfer tattoos, marker pen or glitter

Any exceptions to this policy must be approved by the school Principal.

- Wear only natural nail polish and clear lip gel.
- Wear only studs or sleepers in ears with no more than two earrings in the lobe of each ear.
- Wear only "special" jewellery such as medical bracelets which have significance to be worn.
- Wear other body pearcings at school or on any school activity.

Children who come to school out of uniform will be asked to wear a clean uniform provided by the school (if available) and will be expected to have it washed and returned. Failure to wear school uniform may result in the child not being able to represent our school.

NB: Many of these expectations are for WHS and Wellbeing reasons.
