The Passport to Learning is where students record each activity, along with the time spent, and is validated from either the Learning Destination, the in-school coordinator or a Children's University Project Officer (parents cannot stamp or sign a child's passport).



What activities can be included?

Learning activities must take place outside of the normal school curriculum time, so activities before school, in recess, at lunchtime and after school are included as well as weekend and school holiday activities.

Some examples include, but are not limited to:

- Any club /association based activity sport/musical/cultural (capped at 10 hours)
- School clubs/groups (occurring before, at lunch after school- capped at 10 hours)
- Online learning experiences (CU has a website full of new learning experience)
- Community events eg -museums, art galleries, cultural festivals and events, workshops etc (capped at 2 hours.)

Students must provide evidence of learning to the 1.in-school coordinator, this could be, but is not limited to, a video or written diary, photos of the experience, a conversation with the school coordinator about what the student learnt, a piece of craft created as part of the experience, a poster or presentation, or a worksheet provided at the experience.

QLearning Destinations On Campus Discovery

The CU Newcastle program aims to link children and families to opportunities for extra learning within their own communities. Learning destinations are local businesses, clubs, libraries and associations that are in partnership with CU Newcastle. Learning Destinations are able to stamp or validate learning in a students' passport and are regularly promoted on the CU Newcastle facebook page

The CU web portal has been created for all students enrolled in Children's Universities across Australia and New Zealand. Online activities are uploaded regularly and students can log in, complete these activities and submit them to their in-school coordinator for more time in their passport (opt-in).
