

009 Leadership

- The 009 Leadership Program is a unique program to KSPS
- It gives all Year 6 students to take on an active leadership role within the school. They will learn and develop leadership skills that focus on personal improvement, team work, developing confidence and courage and leadership skills.
- Students nominate themselves, then go through an interview process, followed by a training day and overnight camp.

Wellbeing – PBL & Visible Wellbeing



- Positive Behaviour for Learning is a whole school approach for creating a positive, safe and supportive school climate in which students can learn and develop. This approach involves the school community working together. Our school's expectations are Kind, Safe, Proud and Supportive. The Tawny represents our school and our values.
- When we feel good, we function well. We understand the importance of supporting and educating our students to ensure that we empower our students to make positive choices that contribute to the wellbeing of themselves and their peers.



Awards and Leadership

- Primary assemblies will take place on Friday on even weeks from 1-1:40pm. Please sign in with the QR code provided on arrival
- Students are recognised with Merit, Sportsmanship and PBL awards.
- Tawny Badge assemblies are held once in Term 1 and 4 and twice in Term 3 and 2. Students receive a Tawny Badge when they have successfully completed all outcomes on their Stage 3 Contracts.
- Students wishing to be run for leadership roles in 2023 will have to have received their Tawny Badge within the 2022 year.

Year 6 Shirts

- We have started the planning to ensure Year 6 shirts are ordered before the end of term.
- Students should receive their shirts in Term 2.
- The cost is generally around \$55



Buddies

- The 'Buddies' program matches Kinder and Yr 6 students to work together on learning activities and social skills.
- Kinder teachers and Yr 6 teachers are currently getting to know their students before assigning Buddies.
- Planning is taking place to begin soon..



Dux and Major Awards

- At the end of the year on presentation day, three major academic prizes are awarded for Dux, English and Mathematics.
- These awards are for Year 6 students who have demonstrated excellence throughout the year.
- Awards are determined by calculating the highest scores across all common assessment tasks for Mathematics, English and overall.
- Other major awards such as Citizenship and Creative and Performing Arts are determined by student achievement, teacher nomination and voting.



We hope that Stage 2 and Stage 3 will have the opportunity to participate in the Children's University program this year.

There is a new funding model. A representative from Children's University is meeting with Mrs Tan and Mr Russell in March. As soon as we have more information about the program for 2022, we will let you know.

Stage 2 and Stage 3 students will again have the opportunity to participate in the ICAS Assessments. These assessments are designed for recognising academic excellence for high potential students.

The options are Digital Technologies, Science, Spelling, English, Writing and Mathematics. The assessments take place in August or September and they will be conducted online.

Seasons for Growth

Seasons for Growth is a support group that assists students who are dealing with change, grief or loss in their lives. This program runs for 8 consecutive weeks and uses the seasons of the year as a metaphor for the stages of grief and loss.

Change, grief and loss can be (but not limited to): death of somebody close, family separation, moving homes etc.

This program is run in small age appropriate groups from Year 1 through to Year 6.



BRAVE program

The BRAVE program is aimed for students who worry or who deal with anxiety. The program teaches students strategies to support their feeling and emotions when they feel this way.

This program is run for students in Years 3-6 in a small group setting.

Teachers will nominate students for these programs in consultation with parents.
